The modern coins found at Zakrzów, Site 28, Niepołomice Borough, Wieliczka County, Lesser Poland Voivodeship

This article describes the modern coins found during the archaeological rescue excavations conducted under the direction of the Krakow Team for Excavations on Motorways in the years 2010–2012. At the Zakrzów 28 site, the exploration work was carried out prior to the construction of the motorway A4 (as part of its Kraków–Tarnów section) (Map 1). The archaeological excavations conducted at this site yielded 5 coins. These are copper shillings (*szelągi*) struck during the reign of King John II Casimir (1648–1668): crown shillings (*szelągi koronne*) – 2 specimens and Lithuanian shillings (*szelągi litewskie*) – 3 specimens. All the coins in question are loose finds, without any particular stratigraphical context. They were unearthed in the plough layer of the soil.
